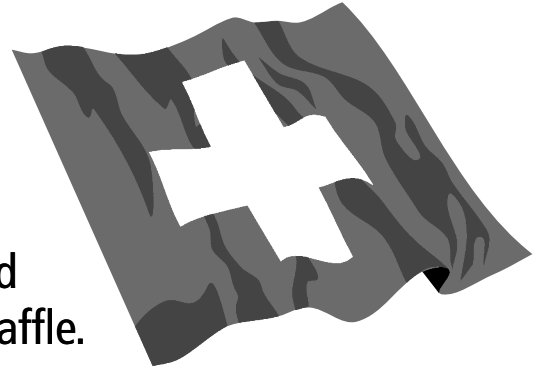

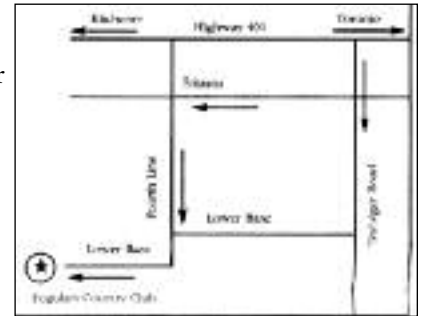

Die nächsten Gäste sind die obskuren Urlauber Kevin Mühlemann (Rene Wälti) und sein Freund/Kollege Roman Fischer (Franz Zuber), die so einiges zu verheimlichen haben nach ihrem Diamanten Raub in Amsterdam, sowie Catherine "mit C" Morgenstern (Stefanie Oechslin), die mit ihren roten Haaren und engen sexy Pullover "zufällig" auch Ferien im Stroh machen will.

Council of the Swiss abroad (CSA)/Auslandschweizer- Organisation (ASO)/Conseil des Suissees de l'etranger (CSA)

As of 2009 I have been your CSA delegate covering Ontario and the Central Provinces. Other elected delegates live in Ottawa, Montreal and Vancouver. We regularly exchange views and are in the process of creating a platform in order that the whole Canadian Swiss community can come forward with ideas, requests and issues.

Over the last two years I have been involved in the meetings in Lucerne, Berne and St. Gall. Some of the topics up for discussion at these CSA/ASO meetings are e.g.:

- Creating of a law covering the Swiss living abroad
- Facilitation of the interests and political rights stemming from abroad (e.g. E-voting, participation in voting of CH councils of States)
- Promotion of international mobility of Swiss (Bilateral Agreements on free movement of persons, reduction of hurdles etc.)
- Adequate consular care (sufficient network of consulates, extension of E-Government)
- Extension of the communication with the "Fifth Switzerland" (Swiss Revue, Swissinfo, SwissCommunity)
- Upgrading of the Council of the Swiss abroad as a representative organ of the "Fifth Switzerland"
- Strengthening/expansion of the international presence and participation of Switzerland

The number of Swiss living abroad increases every year (now over 700'000). To date, one out of ten Swiss lives outside of Switzerland.

The Swiss are very mobile and the voices of the "Fifth Switzerland" need to be heard. We invite and encourage you to join and register on the existing platform www.SwissCommunity.org. This will help you stay in touch with other Swiss living abroad.

The next meeting will take place in Lugano on August 26 – 28th, 2011, I will be attending and will inform you about its outcome.

Students and Seniors: \$4.00

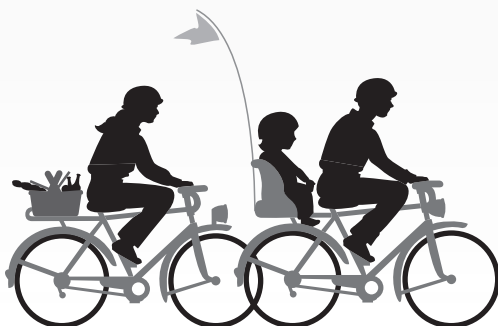
