From the President's file . . .

Matt Lebar and the Hansens had standing ovations; no further comments are necessary. Mike Cumberland with his Alphorn is always a plus, especially with his two children by his side.

The raffle table was bigger than ever! Examples of prizes were: a flight to anywhere in North America, helicopter rides, weekends spent in top hotels, Swiss watches, a Racclette set, lots of great gift certificates for a variety of stores and restaurants... just to mention a few. SwissMar even went out of their way to print special discount flyers for us for their sale in September.

The many volunteer hours of work put into organizing and knowing that we can get this much support from sponsors, businesses and the community at large certainly makes this event worthwhile. **Thank you all again.**

NOW ON THE ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES...

Section Grants

The Club received three grant requests this year from sections, two of which were approved. Decisions were made based on a silent vote by the Board members. The Club has specific procedures to be followed by all section heads when requesting a grant from the Board.

The Jass section requested a grant, which was denied. I would like to inform all members that this grant was not denied because of the Swiss Club's funding levels to support the sections. In reality, the application from the Jass section was not accepted due to incomplete information on the grant request. The chairperson (or replacement) for that section was not available for questions/clarification prior to or on the day of the grant request meeting. Unfortunately as a result of the grant denial, the chairperson of that section chose to resign. I was not willing to loose a section in the club, without exploring all avenues to find a solution. Therefore, I made within a week the chairperson of the Jass section a very acceptable offer that would guarantee it could continue into next season without financial difficulties (therefore not requiring it to find private sponsors on its own). We were going one step further by guaranteeing that we would propose a change in the by-laws of the Club at the next AGM regarding "rent payments", thereby simplifying their grant requests.

I am sorry to say that all my efforts to keep this section under the umbrella of the Club were not entirely taken into consideration. Sadly to say, the chairperson of the Jass section has decided to create his own group away from the Swiss Club Toronto. The section had 33 Swiss Club members (18 paying memberships) last season. Results of the Board's original decision and back-up that arose from the denial are available upon request. The Club is more than willing to support the sections financially if necessary, provided that they comply with the Clubs regulations and procedures.

I would like to thank Albert Lenz for all his support and input rendered to the Swiss Club Toronto in his years as chairperson of the Jass section. We are sad to see him go.

Since this is the last issue of *Tell Tale* this year, even though it's early, I don't want to miss the chance to wish you all a VERY HAPPY HOLIDAY SEASON.
