## The President's file...

It is hard to believe, but summer just flew by quickly and the year 2012 is slowly coming to a close.

We had, as usual, a good year with lots of interesting activities from all sections of the Club. On June 30th, the Swiss Club did an organized trip to the Grand Concert of the 40th North American Swiss Singing & Yodeling festival (aka Sängerfest) which took place in Kitchener. This event, which is held every 3 years, has existed since 1897. The event had over a dozen different singing and yodeling groups from Switzerland, Canada and the US. The attendance at the Grand Concert was over 1800 people from all over Ontario. A total of 40 of our members took advantage of our organized trip. Even though the weather was hot and we drove in a school bus to Kitchener, there weren't any complaints and everybody enjoyed the great concert. By the way, the next Sängerfest will be in New Glarus, Wisconsin, in 2015, so maybe we will plan a trip again in three years.

On July 29th, we celebrated our Swiss National Day in the beautiful Gambrel Barn at the Country Heritage Park in Milton (see photos on back cover). The weather was perfect and again many members and non-members took advantage of that. Overall, the attendance was around 500 people and everyone had a great time.

The main entertainment this year was provided by The Hansens Family (3 generations) and Matt Lebar. Their mix of Singing, Yodeling, 'Cow-Belling' and Alphorn playing excited everybody in the barn. Also Eva Hajda again played her alphorn as intro to the official part of the celebration and Eugen Schubert entertained outside with is Hand-Örgeli and Trumpet. Thanks to all of you for an entertaining afternoon.

Upstairs in the barn, Suzy Hubler took care of the little ones again and as last year we had the shoe toss outside, where the winners walked away with some fine prizes. Adrian Vogt of Trident Catering once again made sure we didn't have to stay hungry with a fare of traditional Swiss food. As usual there was also coffee and Nussgipfeli which, by the way sold out completely this year.

The final highlight, as every year, was our eagerly awaited raffle which offered great prizes, including Air Canada flights, helicopter rides, lots of chocolate and wine and other great prizes. Again we would like to extend our great thanks to all our sponsors. They play an important role in making the festivities a success. A big thank-you goes to all our volunteers. Without them it would be impossible to put this all together. Thanks to each and everyone!

On a sad note, our Consul General, Bernadette Hunkeler-Brown (who again was our special guest together with her husband Nigel Brown) had to inform us in her speech, that the Swiss Consulate in Toronto would be closing in 2013 and that consular matters would be handled by Montreal after that. This is obviously a big blow for the Swiss Community in the GTA as we have a strong relationship with the Swiss Consulate. Vreni Ducommun, Ernst Notz and I decided to get a petition going at the Swiss National day against the closing. We collected a total of 270 signatures which were then sent to the Parliament and Federal Counsel in Switzerland. In the meantime we received a somewhat expected reply from Federal Counsel Didier Burkhalter. You can read the letter on our webpage (there is a link on the main page). We tried, but unfortunately we weren't successful in changing their minds.

Looking forward: This year, in place of the Santa Claus afternoon, we are planning a Pre-Christmas Social Gathering which is open to all our members (not just kids). It will take place on Sunday, December 2nd. You will find more information about this event in this edition of the Tell Tale. As the year draws to a close, I would like to take this opportunity to wish all club members Happy Holidays, Merry Christmas and all the best in the New Year.

# Council of the Swiss abroad (CSA)/Auslandschweizer-Organisation (ASO)/Conseil des Suisses de l'etranger (CSA)

I planned to report to you on last year's conference in Lugano but unfortunately I could not get any space in last year's *Tell Tale*. It was when the Swiss elections to the various Councils took place and when we were unfortunately not successful in electing a Swiss candidate living abroad to the CH council of State.

The ASO (CSA) delegates, Vreni Ducommun-Tobler, Kati Lyon-Villiger (Ottawa), Ernst Notz and Bruno Setz (Montreal) attended the annual meeting in beautiful Lausanne in August 2012. I travelled also to the March meeting in Bern.

This year's 90th Congress was attended by roughly 80 voting members from all over the world and attracted many Swiss celebrities(e.g. BR Didier Burkhalter, various Ambassadors including EDA delegate G. Bruegger, Economists, Politicians, Swatch inventor Elmar Mock, Nobel prize winner Kurt Wuethrich etc).

The motto of the Congress in Lugano was around the unique system of direct Swiss Democracy in the international context whereas this year's theme of the "Fifth Suisse" in Lausanne focused on "mobility and innovation" and many prominent speakers were present and addressed some potential dangers that Switzerland could face in the coming years.

#### Some of other topics discussed at this year's CSA/ASO meetingwere:

Trend of Swiss Consulates closings all over the world and the role of the Honorary Councils. Of course, the potential closing of our Toronto Consulate General (together with Chicago/L.A. in the USA) is hard to understand (to put it politely) and I raised the voice in front of very popular attendants and protested this decision. At the 1st of August celebration in Milton we also collected roughly 250 signatures (thank you all!) and the petition was passed on. Let's see what will happen! The relationships between EDA/ASO are very important and were brought up at both meetings. Please note that EDA offers a 365-day www.helpline-eda.ch for the Swiss living abroad.

Update of the progress creating a Federal law covering the Swiss living abroad (it could take up to three years to put it in force!), but a sub-commission is working on its progress and potential implementation.

Importance of Swiss schools abroad (there are now 18) and AJAS will celebrate its 50th anniversary, Swissinfo (presentation of new strategy), Schweizer Revue (now 4 publications per year; www.revue.ch)

A petition "E-voting for all" with 12,000 signatures (including approx. 150 from Toronto) was handed over to BR Burkhalter with the goal that everybody abroad can vote electronically at the next federal elections in 2015.

The "unsatisfactory" treatment of their North American clients by the Swiss banks, the hardship to obtain health insurance in CH once reached a certain age, and many other problems facing the Fifth Suisse were discussed at these ASO meetings.

There will be an "Auslandschweizerplatz" in Brunnen and the winning symbol project is named "Sprungbrett/Tremplin/Diveboard"

Did you have a chance to register at www.SwissCommunity.org which will help to stay in touch with our home country and other Swiss living abroad? They have now over 10 000 members. Please also visit www.aso.ch/en for more information (e.g. if you have younger children they offer camps and language courses in CH)

The next annual meeting will take place in Davos on August 16th, 2013. Note: Ernst Notz attends the ASO meetings twice a year at his own expenses (flights/hotel etc.). He is also a board member of the SCCC for over 10 years (and organized 6 times their Dinner & Dance coming up on November 17th); he is also president of the Canadian Swiss Cultural Association (ASO) and can advise you in insurance matters (NACORA broker, p.o. Kuehne + Nagel).


