The congress opened with a reception and the president, Jacques-Simon Eggly, greeted 96 delegates from across the world and Switzerland. The first business of the day was the confirmation of the newly elected country delegates, the election of the OSA and Swiss Revue executives. Canada was represented by Delegates from Eastern: Bruno Setz; Western: newly elected Silvia Schoch from Victoria/BC and myself for Central Canada.

The recent consular closures in North and South-America were hotly debated and many delegates including myself requested to speak. The consular closing in Toronto negatively affects the Swiss citizens living in this consular area and the loss of Swiss image and presence also impacts on business relationships. Also in my function as the president of the Swiss Canadian Chamber of Commerce in Ontario, I explained the consequences and reinforced the importance of being well established in the biggest city and economic capital of Canada. The loss of Swiss image and presence across the world and the loss of support of political and economic activity between Switzerland and these countries impacts us all negatively at a time when our home country needs to increase its presence in a globalized world.

The globalization of the economy, the migration and institutions were the main topics in workshops between the expert panel and the delegates. Buendner VIPs addressed the audience and the former Secretary of State and political director of EDA, Franz von Daeniken, spoke on the topic of "Switzerland, globally, regionally, locally". He characterized Switzerland

as "Denkplatz-Werkplatz-Finanzplatz (place of thinking/creativity, work and finance). According to him this means that CH needs to be strongly engaged in the UN and also anchored and in cooperation with other similar-thinking organizations and nations. Particularly, in Europe where more than 400'000 of the over 715'000 Swiss make home within the EU.

Electronic voting, the draft of the national legislation for the Swiss Abroad "Bundesgesetz ueber die Schweizer Personen und Institutionen im Ausland", and the revision of a pending inheritance tax agreement between France and Switzerland (by the French Ambassador to CH, Mr. M. Duclos) were further topics.

An interesting presentation followed by the Director of Swiss Tourism, Juerg Schmid, and an excellent overview of his tenure of 25 years by Mr. Rudolf Wyder, retiring OSA Director. The highlight of the conference was the final address to OSA delegates by the Federal Councilor Widmer-Schlumpf: she summarized the importance of the 5th Switzerland to CH in a globalized world. "Quality, Stability, Integrity" were the main words to describe the Swiss financial market place and for all of Switzerland and its industries to know its qualities of high stability, education and quality output.
