The President's File

Dear members,

The year 2018 is not over yet but what a year it has been so far! A century after its creation in 1918, the Swiss Club Toronto is still going strong, with lots of activities loved by all.

Following the very successful performance of "Miss Sophie's Erbe" by our Theatre section in April (see previous edition of *Tell Tale*), a group of members and guests went to the Woodbine Casino on June 8 for a day of fun at the races organised by Paula. On June 23, the Men's section welcomed members to the Egger Farm for their annual BBQ.

Soccer fans met at the Rushton pub on St. Clair on June 17, 22, 27 and July 3 to cheer for Switzerland at the 2018 FIFA World Cup. Spirits were high and a good crowd of supporters filled the patio for each game the Nati played. Fans were also able to test their soccer knowledge thanks to fun quizzes, and win great prizes. Even though Switzerland did not go further than the round of 16, those were good games and everyone had a great time. Thank you Arno and Nadia for making the Swiss fan zone at the Rushton happen.

As every year since 1932, the main summer event of our club was the celebration of the Swiss National Day, which this year happened in two occasions. First, we had our main celebration on July 29 at the Country Heritage Park in Milton, where a good crowd of over 400 attendees gathered in and around the Gambriel Barn to enjoy lunch, have a drink, chat with friends, enjoy music and celebrate our heritage. We were honoured by the visit of Elisabeth Bösch Malinen, our Consul General from the Consulate of Switzerland in Montreal, who gave an address and congratulated the club for its 100th anniversary. We were also glad to welcome our Honorary Consul of Switzerland in Toronto Beat Guldimann and his wife Marcella. Entertainment was provided by the Ländlertrio Seetal from Switzerland, who regaled us with traditional Swiss music, as well as by two members of the Trillium Alphorns, Eva Hajda and Erwin Oechslin. Suzi Hubler made sure to keep our youngest members entertained with crafts and a magic show, while attendees were free to peruse the wares of our various vendors. The day ended as always by our famous raffle and a dizzying array of prizes courtesy of our generous sponsors. I'd like to thank the whole team of volunteers who put together another successful National Day celebration, in particular our past president Sascha Frassini. Thank you for your hard work. Our thanks also go to our sponsors (see list page 8) who make this event possible every year.

But that wasn't all. On August 1st, the actual Swiss National Day, we celebrated with a raising of the Swiss flag in front of Toronto City Hall for the first time ever. Coordinated by our Honorary Consul Beat Guldimann and sponsored by the Consulate, the Swiss Canadian Chamber of Commerce as well as the Swiss Club, this event was another well attended and successful occasion. It was quite a unique sight to witness the small red flag with the familiar cross be raised against a backdrop of skyscrapers and a busy Canadian metropolis, in sharp contrast to the mountains and green pastures we usually associate with it. The Trillium Alphorns added to the effect by replacing the sounds of the city by the traditional music of the Swiss mountains. Addresses were given by City Councilor Jim Karygiannis, Honorary Consul of Switzerland in Toronto Beat Guldimann, President of the Swiss Canadian Chamber of Commerce Alexandra Soriano, as well as myself. The official part was followed by an apéro featuring delicious Swiss specialities.

The summer carried on with the annual canoe trip organized by the Gym section at Algonquin Park during the August 4-6 long weekend. On August 28, the author Diccon Bewes, a British expat who's been living in Switzerland for a long time, gave an entertaining lecture about his adoptive country. We still have some signed copies of his books, please contact me if you're interested in buying one. On September 8, a sold-out crowd embarked on the *Lady Muskoka* for an Anniversary Cruise on Lake Muskoka, pairing an excellent lunch with the beautiful views of late summer in Ontario. Immediately afterwards, on September 9, the Amicale Romande had the cheese grills at the ready for their ever popular Raclette afternoon at Simeon Park north of the city! Throughout the summer, the Club partnered with other organizations to promote Swiss culture in Toronto by welcoming Swiss musicians at the TD Toronto Jazz Festival, presenting a Swiss co-production at the Cinéfranco francophone film festival and a selection of documentary films with links to Switzerland at the Planet in Focus festival.

The grand finale of our 100th anniversary celebrations was however without question the Anniversary Gala on September 29 at the Old Mill Toronto. Led by our Master of Ceremonies Peter Schurmann, this momentous event was attended by over 220 people, including special guests Dr. Beat Nobs, Ambassador of Switzerland in Ottawa, Beat Guldimann, Honorary Consul of Switzerland in Toronto and his wife Marcella and Beth Zurbuchen, CEO of

the Swiss Center of North America in New Glarus, Wisconsin, who all gave thoughtful addresses. A total of 8 past and current presidents of the Swiss Club were in attendance (see picture gallery on page 7). Following hors d'oeuvres, a delicious dinner was served on tables impeccably decorated by former club president Sonja Evans, and followed by a very special anniversary cake which was ceremoniously cut by Ambassador Nobs and myself. Entertainment was provided by the indefatigable Trillium Alphorns, accordeonist Matt Lebar and the Howard Lopez Band, who also led the dance that followed the dinner. The evening went by quickly, the dancing only stopping for drawing the fabulous door prizes, once again donated by the generous sponsors listed on page 8. Pictures of past events were projected during the entire evening, as well as a short video which was commissioned specially to commemorate this event. It can be seen on our website swissclubtoronto.ca, don't miss it! Guests did not leave the party empty handed, for a "goodie bag" was presented to all attendees containing a specially engraved commemorative cheese board, as well as a booklet with a short history of the Swiss Club Toronto. As your delegate for Ontario and Central Canada, I participated in the 96th congress of the Swiss Abroad that took place in Visp, from August 10 to 12, 2018. This was a great occasion for meeting with the other Delegates from Canada, who all attended the Congress, and with participants from all over the world. Many points were discussed, and a detailed summary of the session can be read on the ASO website (https://www.aso.ch/). In particular, I would like to call the attention of the readers of Tell Tale and of the members of the Swiss Club Toronto, to the launch of the following online petition, calling on the Federal Council and parliament to make electronic voting accessible to all Swiss abroad by 2021. Most of the Swiss living in Canada do not encounter major difficulties with the system of postal vote. However, in other parts of the world, some of our fellow citizens receive their voting documents too late (or never receive it at all), which makes it difficult for them to exercice their political rights as Swiss citizens. Therefore, I would like to encourage you to sign online this petition in support of e-voting. Many thanks for your support!

The online petition launched by the Swiss Abroad organisation at the 96th Congress of the Swiss Abroad in Visp aims to enable all Swiss Abroad to take part in votes and elections. They often receive their documentation too late and are therefore unable to exercise their political rights.

The online petition can be signed on the website: www.evoting2021.ch until 28 November 2018. We will then submit the petition to the Federal Chancellery on 30 November 2018.

In Memoriam ROBERT WALDER

Founder of the Jass section of the Swiss Club Toronto February 7, 1936–July 4, 2018

In the spring of 1974, while reading the Tages Anzeiger, an article from the Swiss Club Johannesburg caught Robert's attention. It was about a successful Jass championship their club had held. This story intrigued him so much, that he started to talk to friends and members of the Swiss Club Toronto about organizing a Jass club here. The response was very positive and he made a proposal to the board of the Swiss Club to organize a Jass section, which was approved. In the fall of 1974, the first championship was held at the Austrian Club Edelweiss with a good turnout of over 50 members. After it could no longer accommodate the Jassers, they moved to the German Club Harmonie, and then on to the Bond Place hotel. At this location, they had the penthouse with lots of windows and a beautiful view over the city. However, it was soon discovered that the large windows reflected the cards held by the opposite player and some took advantage of the situation! From then on the curtains were drawn - so much for the beautiful view!

We played a lot of games over the past 44 years in our Jass section. Robert Zuend took over the chairman's duties 1984 and I in 1987. We played at many different locations, at Ozzie Schaller's place, the Primrose Hotel, at the Old Country Inn, the Silly Goose, the Donauschwaben Club, the Prince Hotel, and now we play in the Agincourt Room on Bridletowne Circle.

Besides his enthusiasm for playing the Swiss card game, Robert also took great pleasure in travelling all over the world. Especially after his retirement from his long-time employer, the Canadian institution called "Canadian Tire".




